20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The BLM's Northeastern Great Basin Resource Advisory Council reviews projects and programs and advises the designated Federal officer regarding the management of public land resources within the RAC's jurisdiction. The RAC provides input from the various stakeholders who use public lands.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Northeastern Great Basin Resource Advisory Council is composed of 15 members distributed in a balanced fashion among the following groups. Category I includes those holding Federal grazing permits or leases, interests associated with transportation or rights-of-way, developed outdoor recreation, OHV users, or commercial recreation activities, commercial timber industry, or energy and mineral development. Category II includes nationally or regionally recognized environmental organizations, dispersed recreation activities, archaeological and historical interests, or nationally or regionally recognized wild horse and burro interest groups. Category III includes state, county, or locally elected office-holders, employee of a State agency responsible for the management of natural resources, Indian Tribes within or adjacent to the area for which the RAC is organized, are employed as academicians in natural resource management or the natural sciences, or represent the public-at-large.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The RAC did not meet in FY 2020. The RAC typically meets 2-4 times a year.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The RAC allows BLM managers to receive advice and feedback from a wide variety of interested citizens in a single forum. The RAC provides the various interests a single forum to discuss issues, develop guidelines, and reach consensus.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings are open to the public.

21. Remarks

There were no meetings held in FY 2020.

Members will be reassigned as appropriate to the Sierra Front-Northern and Mojave-Southern Great Basin RACs in FY 2021. 1/3 of the Northeastern Great Basin (2063) Resource Advisory Council was consolidated with the Sierra Front Northwestern Great Basin (2064) Resource Advisory Council to create the Sierra Front Northern Great Basin (84607) Resource Advisory Council. The other 2/3 of the Northeastern Great Basin (2063) Resource Advisory Council was consolidated with the Mojave Southern Great Basin (2062) Resource Advisory Council.
