20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The National Navigation Safety Advisory Committee (NNAVSAC) provides advice and recommendations to the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), through the Commandant, U.S. Coast Guard, on matters relating to maritime collisions, ramming's, and groundings; Inland Rules of the Road; International Rules of the Road; navigation regulations and equipment; routing measures; marine information; and aids to navigation systems.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

NNAVSAC is composed of not more than 21 members who are appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Secretary of DHS. Each member shall have particular expertise, knowledge and experience in maritime collisions, rammings, and groundings; Inland Rules of the Road; International Rules of the Road; navigation regulations and equipment; routing measures; marine information; and aids to navigation systems. To assure balanced representation, members shall be appointed to represent the viewpoints and interests of one of the following groups or organizations, and at least one member shall be appointed to represent each membership category: (a)Commercial vessel owners or operators; (b)Professional mariners; (c)Recreational boaters; (d)the recreational boating industry; (e)State agencies responsible for vessel or port safety; and (f) The Maritime Law Association. Additional persons may be appointed to panels of the Committee to assist the Committee in the performance of its functions.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

NNAVSAC normally meets twice a year; once in the spring and once in the fall. NNAVSAC's recommendations on important issues often form the basis for regulatory changes. The US Coast Guard's review of safety issues requires continued access to NNAVSAC's expertise and advice. NNAVSAC has proven to be an effective forum for developing consensus on contentious issues. In FY23, a hybrid meeting was held in the spring and a virtual meeting was held in the summer.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

NNAVSAC's broad representation provides the US Coast Guard a forum that is otherwise unavailable to evaluate the impact of proposed US Coast Guard actions, to identify navigation safety issues needing US Coast Guard attention, and to generate informed solutions to navigation safety issues. Because of the expertise of Committee members and its reputation in the maritime community, NNAVSAC has become a forum where members of the public bring contentious issues for advice.

The Coast Guard presented three new task statements to the Committee: NNAVSAC Task Statement 23-01: Review of Draft Navigation and Vessel Inspection Circular (NVIC) on Navigation Safety in and around Offshore Renewable Energy Installations (OREI). NNAVSAC Task Statement 23-02: Defining the term "prudent mariner" referenced in the regulations, on nautical charts and in navigation publications. NNAVSAC Task Statement 23-03: Recommendation to clarify the term "crosses a navigational channel" as used in Rules of the Road, Rule 27. All three were resolved, in addition to one task statement from 2021: NNAVSAC Task Statement 21-01: Electronic Charts and Navigational Equipment Carriage Requirements

In FY23, five Task Statements were resolved and accepted for implementation. NNAVSAC Resolution 23-02: The Committee provided NNAVSAC Resolution 23-02 which defined the term "prudent mariner" referenced in the regulations, on nautical charts and in navigation publications. The Coast Guard accepted the definition and will utilize it if/when queried about the term in our regulations and publications. NNAVSAC Resolution 23-03: The Committee provided NNAVSAC Resolution 23-03 which clarified the term "crosses a navigational channel" as used in Rules of the Road, Rule 27. In addition, the resolution recommended that 33 CFR 83.27 be revised to remove special lighting methods. The Coast Guard accepted the resolution and will amend the Rules of the Road in a future rulemaking. NNAVSAC Resolution 21-01 and Annex A: The Committee provided NNAVSAC Resolution 21-01 entitled "Electronic Charts and Navigational Equipment Carriage Requirements" which included five (5) recommendations for the implementation and maintenance of an electronic chart system that should be, at a minimum, equivalent to a paper chart inventory or vice versa. The Coast Guard accepted the resolution and Annex A and will include input from the resolution and Annex in a future rulemaking. NNAVSAC Resolution 23-01A: The Committee provided NNAVSAC Resolution 23-01A entitled "Review of Draft Navigation and Vessel Inspection Circular (NVIC) on Navigation Safety in and around Offshore Renewable Energy Installations (OREI)". The resolution acknowledged the review and provided a draft NVIC and recommended the Coast Guard use the draft as a final NVIC.
