20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Inland Waterways Users Board (IWUB) is statutorily required to report annually to the Secretary of the Army and the U.S. Congress with recommendations on inland waterways investment priorities and funding levels. These annual reports focus on investment prioritization of inland waterways projects, efficient funding in future Federal budgets for domestic spending and infrastructure investment, the ability of the Inland Waterways Trust Fund to fund the non-Federal share of future modernization and rehabilitation costs for the designated inland waterways, and application of sound business principles to develop an affordable investment program. The Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) of 2014 also requires the IWUB to submit advice and recommendations on the budget for each fiscal year.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

IWUB representative members represent inland waterways transportation service providers (carriers), primary users of these services (shippers), or perform both as a carrier and shipper. Also, they represent a large share of the carrier capacity and the primary and most other types of waterborne commodities moved on the inland waterways system, such as Coal & Coke, Farm & Food products, Petroleum and related products. Members are geographically balanced and may also represent trade and regional development organizations. IWUB recommendations are consensually based on operation experience, waterways traffic and lock utilization, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers capabilities, and funding realities.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The IWUB is required to meet semi-annually by law. The IWUB normally meets three times a year, usually in February/March, July/August, and November/December. The Spring date is to formalize investment recommendations and priorities for inland navigation projects. The Summer meeting is to prepare and analyze information from the President's Budget and Administration testimony. The Fall meeting is to review Congressional actions, budget and appropriations, program direction and project updates. Additional meetings can be called, as needed.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere? Federal statute (33 U.S.C. § 2251) required the Secretary of Defense to establish this FACA committee as the nature of the IWUB's highly specialized advice is not replicated elsewhere.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are not closed to the public unless the DoD determines that items on the planned agenda meet the closed meeting provisions of 5 U.S.C. § 552b(c). Pursuant to DoD policy closed meetings can only be authorized by the DoD Sponsor, the Secretary of the Army, and only after consultation with the Office of General Counsel for the Department of the Army.

21. Remarks

Representative Organizations and their designated individual to represent the company on the IWUB were selected effective 31 January 2024 and 15 February 2024. The Department of Defense highly values the recommendations provided by the IWUB.

For FY24, there were eleven (11) recommendations contained in the IWUB 35th Annual Report to SecArmy and Congress. For FY23 there were seven (7) recommendations contained in the IWUB 34th Annual Report to SecArmy and Congress dated December 2022. There were no recommendations in FY22 as a result of the suspension of activities from the SecDef Zero-based Review (ZBR). The IWUB provides recommendations in an

annual report required by legislation that is prepared at the end of the calendar/start of the next year – the recommendations for calendar year 2022 were available as of the beginning of March 2023. There was no Annual Report nor any recommendations in 2021 due to the ZBR pause. The Annual Report for 2020 was prepared and is dated December 2020 (FY21), it contains six (6) recommendations. The Annual Report for 2019 is dated December 2019 and contains seven (7) recommendations. The correct aggregate number for FY23 is 194 recommendations. Nine (9) recommendations in the 2018 annual report; nine (9) recommendations in the 2017 annual report; nine (9) recommendations in the 2017 annual report; nine (9) recommendations in the 2016 annual report; seven (7) recommendations in the 2015 annual report.
