The Board did not meet in FY 2023.

## 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This Board is currently inactive. The National Park of American Samoa Advisory Board was established by P. L. 100-571 to provide advice to the Secretary of the Interior regarding the management of the National Park of American Samoa. The park was established to preserve and protect the tropical forest and archaeological and cultural resources of American Samoa, and of associated reefs, to maintain the habitat of flying foxes, preserve the ecological balance of the Samoan tropical forest, and, consistent with the preservation of these resources, to provide for the enjoyment of the unique resources of the Samoan tropical forest by visitors from around the world. The Secretary and the Governor, or their designees, are to review the operation and management of the park at least every 10 years. The review is to include, but is not limited to, consideration of how the objectives of the park can better be achieved; the need for additional technical or other assistance; cooperative arrangements between the Government of American Samoa and the National Park Service in the interpretation and management of the park; and the desirability of extension of the lease arrangement.

### 20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings are open.

There were no meetings in FY 2023. The National Park of American Samoa Advisory Board is currently inactive.
