20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Committee members provide viewpoints and share information relevant to the Department of State's formulation, coordination and oversight of foreign policy related to international postal and delivery services. The Committee may also make specific or general policy recommendations.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Approximately twenty-five percent full-time regular government employees, seventy-five percent

representatives of particular interest groups comprising international mailers and providers of international delivery services.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Meetings have been held annually in recent years. The most recent meeting in September 2023 was again held remotely but worked well. Specific agenda items change meeting to meeting but are typically related to policy issues being considered in the Universal Postal Union. This year the meeting focused on the agenda of the 2023 UPU Extraordinary Congress in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, and particularly proposals to further open the union to stakeholders in the wider postal sector and to establish a climate agenda for the UPU. The Department of State considers the meetings to be relevant to its work, since they provide a venue to discuss the views and concerns of mailers, delivery service providers, and other stakeholders.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The advice is obtained elsewhere as well, but the committee is required by specific statutory language found in Section 405 of the Postal Accountability and Enhancement Act (PL 109-435)

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

Meetings are announced in the Federal Register and are open to all those who wish to attend.

This Advisory Committee produces no formal reports but serves as a vehicle to engage key stakeholders on relevant and timely international

postal policy issues before the Department.
