**20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?**

Section 402(b)(9) of the Public Health Service Act states that “the Director, NIH...shall assure that research at...the National Institutes of Health is subject to review in accordance with section 492.”

Section 492(b) states that the “Director of NIH shall establish procedures for periodic technical and scientific peer review of research at the National Institutes of Health. The mission of the Board of Scientific Counselors is to assess the quality of the Institute’s intramural research programs and to evaluate the productivity and performance of intramural scientists and shall

also, as requested by the Director, NIH, undertake peer review of extramural funding applications as required by section 492 of the Public Health Service Act, as amended.” The Board is composed of scientific and technical experts. The Board continues to provide indispensable evaluation and advisory functions in the science management of the intramural research programs. Besides the formal meetings for peer review of each laboratory, the chairman and individual Board members are frequently consulted for advice on staff appointments and program development. The actions of the laboratories reviewed are in keeping with the recommendations of the Board. The Board provides the National Advisory Allergy and Infectious Diseases Council with a review and description of its activities. During FY 2023 the Board made 10 recommendations concerning individual labs and tenure track investigators.

**20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?**

The Board consists of approximately 12 members who are outstanding authorities knowledgeable in the specialized fields of microbiology, immunology, and clinical research allergy and infectious diseases. The advisory role of the board is scientific and substantive. The Board, through periodic visits to the laboratories, assesses the research in progress and evaluates productivity and performance of staff scientists.

**20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?**

The Board met two times, December 12-14, 2022, and June 12-14, 2023, during this reporting period. The Board holds approximately two formal meetings each year for the peer review of

intramural laboratories on a rotating basis as required by the PHS Act.

**20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?**

This Board is composed entirely of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities from outside the NIH in order to secure unbiased and objective evaluation of intramural research programs. Their recommendations are invaluable because the complex nature of research in each laboratory requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from other established resources.

**20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?**

The meetings of the Board of Scientific Counselors, NIAID, were closed for the review, discussion, and evaluation of individual programs and projects conducted by the Institute, including consideration of personnel qualifications and performance, the competence of individual investigators, and similar items, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Section 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permits the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

**21. Remarks**

Committee Function: Other - Scientific and Technical Peer Review. Reports: This committee did not produce any public reports during the fiscal year. The DFO and Decision Maker positions are held by the same person, the Director, Division of Intramural Research, NIAID. The Board makes

recommendations on Intramural lab and confidential personnel matters and the Institute Director has decided that federal staff involvement will be minimal. Dr. Katherine Fitzgerald was reassigned from regular member to serve as Chair from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. Member Dr. Michael L. Diamond was inadvertently omitted on the 2022 ACR report, but has been included on this 2023 report showing his term of 07/01/2022 to 06/30/2027.
