# 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

This committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide evaluation and peer review of Institute laboratories and staff scientists in the fields of arthritis and musculoskeletal and skin diseases.

## 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Board consists of approximately 10 members who are outstanding authorities knowledgeable in the specialized fields of basic and clinical medical sciences related to the fields of arthritis and musculoskeletal and skin diseases. The advisory role of the Board is scientific and substantive. The Board, through periodic visits to the Laboratories, assesses the research in progress and evaluates productivity and performance of staff scientists.

# 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Board met once on May 2-3, 2023 during this reporting period. The committee reviewed programs for 4 laboratory groups, and 1 group of core facilities.

### 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities from outside the NIH in order to secure unbiased and objective evaluation of intramural research programs. Their recommendations are invaluable because the complex nature of research in each laboratory requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from other established resources.

# 20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meeting of the Board was closed with the provisions set forth in section 552b(c)(6), Title 5 U.S.C., as amended for the review, discussion,

and evaluation of individual intramural programs and projects conducted by the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases, including consideration of personnel qualifications and performance, and the competence of individual investigators, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

Cornelius and Salmon were reappointed for 2 years in 2023 and member records were updated to reflect their updated full terms. Two new members, Drs. Polly Ferguson and Kim Bruce Yancey were appointed in 2023 with term end dates of 6/30/2026.
