# 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

This Board interacts with the National Center for Medical Rehabilitation Research (NCMRR) Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) to advise the Center and the Institute as a whole on research opportunities, health needs, and other aspects of medical rehabilitation. The Board is composed of highly qualified scientific and public members who represent many aspects of medical rehabilitation research, health policy, and support for individuals with chronic disabilities. Agendas for these meetings are carefully planned to maximize Board participation and constructive dialogue with NCMRR staff, ex officio members, and other interested parties. The Board has a specific role in providing concept clearance for upcoming NCMRR research initiatives and reviewing the implementation of the NCMRR research plan. The Board assisted the Center in identifying new research opportunities as part of its periodic Report to the Institute Council, which occurs every few years. The Board also has a major role in providing input to the NIH Research Plan for Rehabilitation Research and the NIH Rehabilitation Research Conference, which is updated approximately every five years.

# 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The National Advisory Board on Medical Rehabilitation Research is composed of 18 appointed members and 12 ex-officio members for a total of 30 members. Twelve members are representatives of health and scientific disciplines with respect to medical rehabilitation. Six members are representatives in the interest of individuals undergoing, or in the need of, medical rehabilitation. In addition to the balance of expertise and health perspectives, the board maintains diversity with respect to ethnicity, gender, geography, and inclusion of persons with disabilities. The ex-officio members include: The Director, National Center for Medical Rehabilitation Research; The Director, Eunice

and Human Development; The Director, National Institute on Aging; The Director, National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases: The Director, National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders; The Director, National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute; The Director, National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke; The Director, National Institute on Disability, Independent Living and Rehabilitation Research (formerly National Institute on Disability and Rehabilitation Research), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; The Director, Division of Program Coordination, Planning, and Strategic Initiatives, Office of the Director, National Institutes of Health; The Commissioner for Rehabilitation Services Administration, U.S. Department of Education; The Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs; and The Deputy Undersecretary for Health of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

# 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Board met twice during this reporting period on the following dates: December 5-6, 2022, and May 1-2, 2023, but because of COVID these meetings were shifted to a virtual and hybrid format, which also translated to a more abbreviated meeting. Agenda items are developed by NCMRR staff in conjunction with input from the Board to focus on topics that are particularly timely in the field of medical rehabilitation and relevant to improving the lives of people with disabilities. The agenda is a mix of informational and discussion sessions that often draw on the particular expertise and experiences of the Board members themselves with invited participants as needed. Minutes from each meeting are distributed to

Board members and posted on the NCMRR website to invite further input from the rehabilitation community and general public.

# 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Board is composed of recognized research authorities and leading advocates in the health care community. Because of the broad multidisciplinary nature of medical rehabilitation research and the convergence of biomedical, behavioral, psychosocial, and policy issues, recommendations could not be derived from individual sources in the biomedical or health community. Moreover, this information represents the integration of several viewpoints and balance among research and service priorities. The special nature of these deliberations and consensus of opinion could not be derived from individual interactions of other professional groups, nor developed by NIH staff alone.

The Board advises the Director, NIH, the Director, NICHD, and the Director, NCMRR, on matters and policies relating to NCMRR's medical rehabilitation research and training programs. The Board will review and assess Federal research priorities, activities, and findings regarding medical rehabilitation research and will advise on the provisions of the statute-required comprehensive research plan for the conduct, support, and coordination of medical rehabilitation.

#### **Number of Recommendations Comments**

The December 2022 NABMRR meeting was held in a two-day virtual format. The Board received an update on the NIH Advisory Committee to the Director with respect to the Working Group on Diversity and the inclusion of people with disabilities. The Board received the annual update on the NIH Rehabilitation Research plan and discussed additional strategies for supporting student research projects and broader strategies for

early career development. The Board was updated on Institute plans to enhance diversity within the NICHD, broaden perspectives with the research communities, and address health disparities. The Research Infrastructure Working Group reported back to the Board highlighting six research opportunities and received some additional input from the Board. There was a discussion on incorporating stakeholder engagement and the lived experience into medical research including strategies to improve communication and sustained collaborations. Ther Board heard a scientific talk about the use of virtual reality to improve treatment of neurological conditions. The Board discussed opportunities to improve collaborations among NCMRR, NIH, and the National Institute for Disability, Independent Living, and Rehabilitation Research (NIDILRR), with a particular focus on dissemination and knowledge translation. The Board was updated on the reorganization of the broader NICHD and the functioning of the Institute Advisory Council and the updated NIH Data Management and Sharing Plan. The Board received an update on Rehabilitation as part of Global Health and World Disability Day, which spurred discussion about research opportunities in other countries. The meeting concluded with a presentation on telerehabilitation to broaden access to healthcare, improve outcomes, and address health disparities. The Board made a total of 25 recommendations. The May 2023 NABMRR meeting was held in a two-day hybrid format. The Board received updates about the NCMRR and the NICHD in general. The Board viewed the steady and strategic increase in funding for rehabilitation research. The Board heard about a key NIH conference on ableism in medicine and clinical research and discussed the inclusion of personal goals and resources in the context of clinical management. The Board also got some background on a recent conference on the use of computer modeling in the context of neurorehabilitation and possible strategies for personalizing treatments and improving outcomes. The Board heard a scientific talk on strategies to treat children with developmental disorders and discussed opportunities for early diagnosis and promoting neuroplasticity. A second scientific presentation was delivered on musculoskeletal rehabilitation to improve shoulder function. The Board heard a presentation from the National Science Foundation that highlighted its support for rehabilitation engineering and collaborations with the NIH. This led to a discussion on promoting cross-training of engineers and support of scalable solutions. The Board was updated by the Center for Scientific Review on proposed changes to the peer-review process at the NIH. This led to discussions on how to reduce administrative burdens on applicants, improve research integrity, and reward innovation. The Board heard three integrated presentations on promoting knowledge translation, incorporating new technologies, and improving stakeholder engagement. Finally, the Board approved a concept to renew support of rehabilitation research infrastructure, which led to discussions of supporting new investigators and promoting geographical diversity. The Board made a total of 18 recommendations.
