20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

This committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide evaluation and peer review of Institute laboratories and staff scientists in the following areas: Craniofacial Skeletal Disease, Pain and Neurosensory Mechanisms, Oral Infection and Immunity, Craniofacial Development Biology and Regeneration, Oral and Pharyngeal Cancer, Gene Therapy and Therapeutics, Human Craniofacial Genetics.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Board is composed of approximately 9 members with research interests and responsibilities paralleling those of the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research. Members are outstanding authorities knowledgeable in the specialized fields of oral biology, periodontology, immunopathology, endocrinology, microbiology, infectious diseases and epidemiology. The advisory role of the Board is scientific and substantive. The Board, through periodic visits to the laboratories, assesses the research in progress and evaluates productivity and performance of staff scientists.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Board met twice during this reporting period on the following dates 11/29-30/2022 and 6/6-7/2023. The Board holds approximately two meetings each year for the peer review of intramural laboratories on a rotating basis. The following laboratories were reviewed in FY23: Structural Biology Unit, Pain and Somatosensation Unit, Stem Cell Biochemistry Unit, Skeletal Disorders and Mineral Homeostasis Section, Mucosal Immunology Section, Oral Immunobiology Unit, Immune Regulation Unit, Oral Immunity and Infection Section. The chair of the Board routinely attends and reports to the NIDCR Advisory Council, meets with the Director of the Institute and with the Deputy Director of Intramural Research, NIH.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Board is composed of recognized biomedical

research authorities from outside the NIH in order to secure unbiased and objective evaluation of intramural research programs. Their recommendations are invaluable because the complex nature of research in each laboratory requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available from NIH staff or from other established resources.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the Board of Scientific Counselors, National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research, were closed for the review, discussion, and evaluation of individual programs and projects conducted by the Institute, including consideration of personnel qualifications and performance, the competence of individual investigators, and similar items, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Section 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permits the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

21. Remarks

Committee Function: Other - Scientific and Technical Peer Review. Reports: This committee did not produce any public reports during the fiscal year. The DFO and Decision Maker are the same person, the Director, Division of Extramural Activities. This is a small Institute where limited resources and confidentiality concerns have led the Director to appoint one person for both roles. . Members: The Charter allows the Committee to have 9 authorized members. During fiscal year 2023, 1 member (Dr. Crow) rotated off the

The mission of the Board of Scientific Counselors is to assess the quality of the Institute's intramural research programs and to evaluate the productivity and performance of intramural scientists and shall also, as requested by the Director, NIH, undertake peer review of extramural funding applications as required by section 492 of the Public Health Service Act, as amended."
