20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

This committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical research grant application and/or contract proposals in the fields of biomedical research and behavioral science related to the causes, consequences, prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of alcohol abuse and alcoholism. The committee reviewed 211 grants requesting \$189,532,865.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The reviewers for each meeting are selected to evaluate funding applications and proposals, including but not limited to grant and cooperative agreement applications and contract proposals, for research projects and for research and training activities. Participants for each meeting are assembled to most efficiently and effectively cover the number and breadth of applications or contracts requiring review. The members designated to serve on this committee are authorities knowledgeable in the fields relevant to alcohol abuse and alcoholism in the areas of biomedical, basic and clinical neuroscience, basic behavioral science, treatment, health services, epidemiology, prevention, human development and AIDS.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The committee held 15 FACA meetings during this reporting period. Members also participated in other activities on the following dates:
Workgroups: 3/9/2023, 4/12/2023, 4/14/2023, 4/17/2023, 4/20/2023, 4/27/2023, 5/3/2023, 5/24/2023, 8/15/2023, and 9/5/2023 and contract workgroups were held 11/1/2022, 2/7/2023, and 3/29/2023. These meetings supported the designated mission and the responsibilities of the Institute.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical funding applications and proposals, including but not limited to grant and cooperative agreement applications and contract proposals, for research projects and for research and training activities. These evaluations and recommendations cannot be obtained from other sources because the specialized, complex nature of the applications and contract proposals requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from other established sources.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the committee were closed to the public for the review of grant applications and/or contract proposals. Sections 552(c)(4) and 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permit the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal confidential trade secrets or commercial property such as patentable materials and personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

21. Remarks

Reports: This committee did not produce any public reports. Designated Federal Officer (DFO): The DFO for the NIAAA SEP changed in FY23 and has been reflected in the ACR. The DFO and Committee Decision Maker positions are held by the same individual because of the assignment of responsibilities within the Institute. Members: The members of this Special Emphasis Panel (SEP) do not have standing appointments and serve on an as needed basis for meetings throughout the fiscal year. Therefore, the Members list reflects meeting dates, not appointment start and end dates. While only one meeting date is listed as an

appointment start and end date, a member may have attended several meetings, either as a chairperson, co-chair, or as a member, throughout the fiscal year. Research grant applications submitted to NIH must go through a two-step review process that includes the initial peer review for scientific and technical merit and a second step of review and approval by a National Advisory Council for program relevance. In addition, prior to an award or funding being made, NIH staff must conduct an administrative review for a number of other considerations. These include alignment with NIH's funding principles, review of the project budget, assessment of the applicant's management systems, determination of applicant eligibility, and compliance with public policy requirements. After all these steps have been completed, NIH officials make funding decisions on individual grant applications.
