20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

This committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical research grant applications in mind-body medicine, disease prevention and health promotion, biologically based therapies, manipulative and body-based systems. Operation of this committee is accomplished using a fluid membership, with members designated to serve for individual meetings rather than formally

appointed for fixed terms of service. During the reporting period the committee reviewed 221 applications with an estimated requested amount of \$93,519,917.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

This committee has a fluid membership, with members designated to serve for individual meetings rather than formally appointed for fixed terms of service. The reviewers for each meeting are selected to evaluate grant applications for a specific, perhaps narrow, expertise area. Participants for each meeting are assembled to most efficiently and effectively cover the number and breadth of applications or contracts requiring review.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The NCCIH Special Emphasis Panel held 19 FACA meetings during the FY2023 on the following dates: 10/13&14/22, 10/21/22, 11/9&10/22, 1/13/23, 1/26&27/23, 2/17/23, 3/3/23, 3/16&17/23, 3/17/23, 3/21/23, 3/21/23, 3/28/23, 4/7/23, 6/29&30/23, 6/30/23, 7/12/23, 7/13&14/23, 9/27/23, and 9/29/23. The flexibility in review allowed by this committee structure has proved both efficient and effective.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This committee is composed of recognized authorities in areas of complementary and integrative health relevant to mind-body medicine, disease prevention and health promotion, biologically based therapies, manipulative and body-based systems, and conventional research methodology who represent the forefront of

research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical research grant applications and contract proposals. These evaluations and recommendations cannot be obtained from other sources because the specialized, complex nature of the applications and proposals requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from other established sources.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the NCCIH Special Emphasis Panel were closed to the public in accordance with the provisions set forth in sections 552b(c)(4) and 552b(c)(6), Title 5 U.S.C., as amended. The grant applications and the discussions could disclose confidential trade secrets or commercial property such as patentable material, and personal information concerning individuals associated with the grant applications, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

21. Remarks

This committee did not produce any reports during the reporting period. This committee does not have a dedicated website. The former DFO, Dr. Partap Khalsa retired in December 2022. The new DFO role is Dr. Martina Schmidt. Therefore, there is a different DFO information in FY22 and FY23. The roles of designated federal official and committee decision maker are filled by the same individual terms on the assignment of responsibilities within this center. Members: The members of this Special Emphasis Panel (SEP) do not have standing appointments and serve on an as needed basis for meetings throughout the

fiscal year. Therefore, the Members list reflects meeting dates, not appointment start and end dates. While only one meeting date is listed as an appointment start and end date, a member may have attended several meetings, either as a chairperson, co-chair, or as a member, throughout the fiscal year. Only applications that are favorably recommended by both the initial peer review committee and the Advisory Council may be recommended for funding.
