The membership of the National Advisory Committee on Meat and Poultry Inspection (NACMPI) is balanced by ensuring that all stakeholders have representation on the committee through the appointment of members from the following groups: academia, consumer, industry, and state/local government. Membership of this Committee is also balanced in terms of both expertise in meat and poultry safety, public health, and other FSIS policies, as well as geographic diversity. During second quarter FY23, fifteen new members and five returning members were appointed to NACMPI.

Estimated Number of Meetings per Year - The committee generally meets once a year to discuss and make recommendations on topics designated by the Agency. The committee receives updates on topics from previous years to show how recommendations have been implemented.
