In FY 2017, the Council met once.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Executive Order 13648 required the establishment of an Advisory Council on Wildlife Trafficking to get appropriate expertise to advise the Presidential Task Force on Wildlife Trafficking. The Task Force needed this expertise from the public as we evaluated the on-the-ground issues of wildlife trafficking, including, but not limited to, economic and recreational impacts and conservation impacts.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings have been open to the public.

21. Remarks

The Advisory Council on Wildlife Trafficking (Council) provided advice to the inter-agency Presidential Task Force on Wildlife Trafficking, through the Secretary of the Interior, on issues regarding combating wildlife trafficking. The Council is inactive and we recommend that its charter be allowed to sunset. The Council was not

included in Executive Order 13811, Continuance of Certain Federal Advisory Committees dated September 29, 2017. The charter expired without renewal on August 31, 2017.
