20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

It provided recommendations on issues to be considered in development of new management plans for the Redding and Arcata Field offices, and provided comments for the BLM to consider as it consoloidates the Northwest California and Northeast California RACs in to a new Northern California District Resource Advisory Council. The October meeting was the last for the Northwest California RAC. The Northwestern California RAC brings diverse public land stakeholder viewpoints to the attention of BLM managers working in an area with widely divergent public viewpoints and

varied natural resource issues. The RAC is a venue for the BLM to share information about natural resource management with a wide audience. Members also help share BLM positions with their represented stakeholder groups. BLM Field managers work closely with members to seek opinions and advice in critical planning areas, involving the RAC early in the planning process. The RAC usually meets three to four times a year, with all meetings open to the public. The RAC has been working with the BLM on image and identity issues, and is poised to provide important recommendations on a controversial wind energy development proposal.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Northwestern California Resource Advisory council is composed of 12 members distributed in a balanced fashion among the following groups and within those groups. Specific interests include: Category I includes those holding Federal grazing permits or leases, interests associated with transportation or rights-of-way, developed outdoor recreation, OHV users, or commercial recreation activities, commercial timber industry, or energy and mineral development. Category II includes nationally or regionally recognized environmental organizations, dispersed recreation activities, archaeological and historical interests, or nationally or regionally recognized wild horse and burro interest groups. Category III includes state, county, or locally elected office-holders, employee of a State agency responsible for the management of natural resources, Indian Tribes within or adjacent to the area for which the RAC is organized, are employed as academicians in natural resource management or the natural sciences, or represent the public-at-large. RAC

members are balanced geographically, with members coming from all regions within the RAC's area of interest, and from rural and urban areas.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

No meetings were held in FY 2015.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The committee is necessary to help BLM managers make natural resource management decisions in a collaborative atmosphere, fully involving the people who use, and have an interest in, the public lands.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

All meetings are open to the public. Notices of the meetings are published in the Federal Register, posted on the BLM California website, announced through BLM social media chanels and published in the news media.

21. Remarks

The BLM California State Office terminated this Resource Advisory Council and created a new Northern California District Resource Advisory Council which merged the Northwest and Northeast California Resource Advisory Councils. The new Northern California District Resource Advisory Council was established on June 1, 2015.
