20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Committee provides advice on ATP programs, plans, and policies; reviews ATP evaluation efforts; and reports on the general

health of the program and its effectiveness in achieving its legislatively mandated mission.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Membership is balanced by ensuring the Committee composition reflects the wide diversity of technical disciplines and industrial sectors represented in ATP projects. Because ATP is industry-led, the Committee has significant representation from industry. Members are also drawn from other communities having an interest in ATP, such as, but not limited to, universities, state, local or tribal government bodies, non-profit research institutions, the venture capital community, the economics assessment community and other Federal agencies or laboratories.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

In a typical year the Committee meets at least once a year, and provides comments and feedback after each meeting. A more in-depth annual report is presented to the Secretary of Commerce that provides an assessment of the program, covering topics such as the effectiveness of the program in achieving the mission specified in its legislation, and recommendations for improving the program.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

ATP provides cost-shared awards on a competitive basis to industry for development of high-risk, enabling technologies that can form the basis for new and improved products, manufacturing processes, and services. Since ATP is an industry-led program, often with

university involvement, it is important to have a committee comprised of members from industry, universities, and other organizations having an interest in the program to provide the necessary advice and expertise to keep the program grounded in its guiding principles and focused on its strategic plans.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The Committee advises ATP and NIST on its budget and future planning. As a result, the Committee is thoroughly briefed at its meetings on budget planning and the progress of budgetary actions before the President's budget is released. Portions of the meetings are closed for these discussions in accordance with Section 552(b)(9)(B) of Title 5, United States Code, on the basis that they are likely to divulge matters that may significantly frustrate implementation of proposed actions.
