20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The advisory committee meets at least once a year in a public meeting format to provide the Department of Energy with input on Federal energy management, including how to improve the use of Energy-Saving Performance Contracts and utility energy-efficiency service contracts, improve procurement of ENERGY STAR and other energy efficient products, improve building design, reduce process energy use, and enhance applications of efficient and renewable energy technologies at Federal facilities. During FY 2006, the committee maintained three working groups to explore priority issues of concern to FEMAC; the working groups include: 1) Energy Savings Performance Contracts (ESPC)/Utility Energy Service Contracts (UESC), 2) Sustainable Design, and 3)Strategic Planning. To date, the ESPC Working Group has submitted a two-volume report to the Secretary of Energy, passed a resolution, and prepared a work plan for FY 2007. Volume I (submitted to the Secretary in September 2004) summarizes the history of Federal use of Energy Savings Performance Contracting to finance Federal energy projects and recommends the immediate and permanant authorization of ESPCs. Volume II (submitted to the Secretary of Energy in May 2005) provides recommendations for improving the Federal ESPC program. Resolution 04-01 recommended the immediate and permanent authorizations of ESPCs. The FY 2007 Work Plan, which was approved by FEMAC, establishes three new goals associated with the advancement of ESPCs in the Federal sector. The Sustainable Working Group is drafting a Work Plan for 2007; the working group is formulating a set of goals to encourage the use of sustainable design in Federal facilities government wide. The Strategic Planning Working Group is drafting a work plan that will include a set of proposed FEMAC activities for 2006-2007. All working group documents and recommendations are submitted for the full committee for approval. Accomplishments during FY 2006 include:Conducted a public meeting involving

indepth discussions between the committee and public participants (Federal officials, utilities, ESCOs, NGOs) about the ESPC and UESC financing of Federal energy management projects.

The committee is composed of members representing Federal and state government agencies, energy service companies, utility companies, equipment manufacturers, construction and architectural companies, and other energy-related organizations.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Historically, the Department of Energy has benefitted from an ongoing working relationshop with individuals representing the Federal facilities and operations, building design/construction/equipment and utility industries. These individuals provide DOE with advice on how the Federal Government can work with the private sector and take advantage of their resources and experience to accelerate the adoption of energy saving measures in Federal facilities.

1. Consolidate quality assurance and improvement activities under the auspices of the Federal ESPC Steering Committee.2. Reduce ESPC financing costs to maximize benefit/cost impacts.3. Strengthen Monitoring and Verification procedures and contract adminsitration.4. Continue to periodically assess the performance of ESPC projects.5. Reduce the cycle time and transaction costs of entering into ESPCs.6. Increase the sharing of information and lessons learned between FEMP, Federal agencies, and state and local governments.7. Increase the application of advanced energy efficiency, distributed generation, and renewable energy technologies in ESPCs.8. Promote the benefits of ESPC and encourage permanent authorization.9. FEMAC recommends that DOE make enhancements to the third party financing procedures for ESPC and UESC contracts (e.g., standardized parameters for financier bids and selection, continuerequire ESCOs to receive a minimum of 3 bids per project, require disclosure by teh ESCO of the selection process, and establish a financial dat tracking system and periodically report generic information and finding to the ESCO and financing community).
