During its existance the NPPTAC discussed and developed several recommendations for the Agency to consider. Recommendations were made regarding increasing green building adoption on Tribal land, incorporating the functional use approach into the Office of Pollution Prevention and Toxics activities, lead poisoning prevention from sources other than lead based paint, HPV communications, and Tribal access to to and utilization of publicly available chemical hazard and exposure data. The NPPTAC developed timely advice relevant to current and long-term issues facing EPA, including data development, assessment risk reduction, pollution prevention, Tribal issues, and data and information sharing programs.

The committee terminated in FY 2007.

NPPTAC is a public forum for committee members to discuss issues and develop independent advice that it gives to the EPA Administrator through OPPT. Using the discussions and draft recommendations and advice from its active Work Groups, the Committee is committed to developing timely recommendations relevant to current and long-term issues

facing OPPT's programs, including data development, assessment, risk reduction, pollution prevention, Tribal issues, and data and information sharing programs.

Number of Recommendations Comments

The committee did not meet in FY 2007 and terminated in August 2007. Past recommendations include: The NPPTAC adopted five recommendations concerning aspects of the High Production Volume (HPV) Challenge Program: a specific communication to be sent to all chemical sponsors regarding data entry; a scheme to prioritize assessment of the HPV chemicals; an approach to dealing with chemical categories; general suggestions on the HPV Information System (HPVIS) and outreach and communications about the program; and a specific recommendation on Tribal access to data. Three recommendations concerned aspects of Pollution Prevention (P2): a three-part recommendation seeking a high-level renewal of the commitment to institutionalizing P2, integration within OPPT and across EPA programs, and development of a strategy within OPPT, and a recommendation that OPPT build Tribal understanding of and capacity for implementing green building concepts by more effectively communicating and marketing green building opportunities and benefits to Tribal lands. Another recommendation suggested that EPA consider the Functional Use approach to reduce risks, accomplish pollution prevention objectives, and encourage the use of greener chemistries and cleaner technologies.

Past implementations include all of the HPV recommendations and two of the three parts of the Pollution Prevention recommendations, which are within OPPT's programmatic jurisdiction and are implemented using OPPT's resources. It is difficult to estimate the extent or timing of the implementation of the part of the Pollution Prevention recommendation aimed at the Office of the EPA Administrator and senior Agency leadership. The suggested actions have a broader scope and cut across several EPA offices in Headquarters and the Regions. Implementation of these actions is beyond the management control and resources of OPPT.

What is the approximate <u>Percentage</u> of these recommendations that have been or will be Partially implemented by the agency?

In the past, it was difficult to estimate the extent or timing of the implementation of the part of the Pollution Prevention recommendation aimed at the Office of the EPA Administrator and senior Agency leadership.
