Congress created the ARMS initiative in the National Defense Authorization Act for FY '93, P.L. 102-484. The FY 93 Appropriations Conference Committee then directed the Secretary of the Army to establish a public/private task force to make recommendations on the permanent structure and implementaton of the Armament Retooling and Manufacturing Support Initiative. However, since that time, various other Committees' recommendations affect the issues, concerns, and progress made within the ARMS arena, so there is no longer a need for this Committee. ARMS was disestablished on 15 July 2005 with DoD concurrence in Memo dated 24 August 2005.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

Revised ethics guidance precluded representatives from SGEs. DA/DOD guidance stated that all members of DA/DOD FACAs must be SGE's; therefore the ability for the fourm to continue was greatly hindered. ARMS was disestablished on 15 July 2005 with DoD concurrence in Memo dated 24 August 2005.
