There is no advisory committee within the Department or the Federal Government that possesses sufficient experience to provide the Department with informed advice on policies and procedures related to Department of Energy and contractor nuclear workers who have suffered work-related illnesses. The solicitation of advice and information from the general public or constituent public through a variety of channels, will not satisfy the need for public input in lieu of establishing the proposed advisory committee.
