20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The NAP reviews special education programs and policy of the Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DoDDS). The NAP comments and makes recommendations regarding programs and policy to the Director, DoDEA. The advisory committee functions as the state level advisory committees required by the Individuals With Disabilities Act (IDEA).

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The NAP membership is composed of representatives of persons with disabilities, DoD military/civilian parents of children with disabilities, DoDDS special education and regular education teachers, DoDDS Area and District staff and the military medical departments providing related services and early intervention services to students with disabilities. National experts in the field of special education are nominated to sit on the NAP. The membership is a fair representation of stakeholders in the special education community.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Panel convenes its annual meeting in the spring with an additional meeting in the fall at the discretion of the Panel. The Panel provides advice regarding methods to enhance the educational opportunities offered to students with disabilities in DoDDS. It also provides input into issues dealing with the provision of early intervention and related services. The Spring meeting provides the NAP with an opportunity to consider/comment/advise initiatives for the following school year.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The DoDDS system provides educational opportunities to approximately 70,000 students in 153 schools operated in 14 foreign countries. Of this population, approximately 7,000 students have a disability. As with other school systems, it is important to have input from parents, educators, and representatives of the community/military commands to be able to provide the most effective educational program possible. The Panel concentrates on issues specific to the system's provision of services to children with disabilities.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

21. Remarks

DoDI 1342.12 was revised in December of 2003. The revision merged the two DoD Special Education Adisory Panels that served the overseas and domestic schools. The two Advisory Panels (NAP and DAP) were incorporated into one Advisory Panel for the DoD schools. Legislative action was not required. Membership and Charter are to be developed. DoDI 1342.12, Provision of Early Intervention and Special Education Services to Eligible Dod Dependents, December 6, 2003 establishes a DoD Advisory Panel (DoD-AP)on Early Intervention, Special Education and Related Services, which applies to the DoD Domestic Dependents Elementary and Secondary Schools (DDESS) and the DoD Dependents Schools (DoDDS).
