20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The APAC's authorizing legislation expired on December 31, 2003. Members were invited to join the Automotive & Capital Goods Industry Trade Advisory Committee (ITAC-2). The U.S. Automotive Parts Advisory Committee (APAC) was comprised of representatives of the U.S. automotive parts industry. The Committee provided advice and made recommendations to

DOC and other Administration officials on all issues related to the sales of U.S.-made auto parts in Japanese and other Asian markets. The APAC provided input to the Department for the APEC Automotive Dialogue and for automotive-related discussions with the Government of Japan.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Committee brought together a wide spectrum of representation of the auto parts industry. Included on the Committee were all levels of management from small, medium and large U.S. original equipment and aftermarket auto parts firms as well as representatives from the automotive parts trade associations and the UAW.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The U.S. Automotive Parts Advisory Committee (APAC) met three times during fiscal year 2003 and once during fiscal year 2004. The APAC provided advice to the Department on all issues related to the progress of U.S. auto parts sales to the Japanese and Asian automotive industry.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

There is no substitute for direct advice from those individuals directly involved in selling U.S. auto parts to the Japanese and Asian automotive industry. Having the APAC's input and hearing their experiences enabled the Department to be aware of problems the U.S. auto parts industry faced in its attempts to sell to Japanese and other Asian vehicle manufacturers. The meetings also provided a venue to explore possible alternatives for addressing U.S.-Japan automotive issues as

well as automotive-related issues with other Asian markets. The Committee's issues will now be addressed under ITAC-2.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The Committee meetings were closed to the public because negotiating strategy was discussed, business confidential information was disclosed, USG officials briefed the Committee on U.S.-Japan automotive issues and the APEC Automotive Dialogue, and the Committee provided input for highly sensitive USG negotiating positions for the talks and consultations held with the Japanese and other Asian Governments.

21. Remarks

On December 31, 2003, the APAC's authorizing legislation, the Fair Trade in Automotive Parts Act of 1998, Section 3804 of Public Law 105-261, expired. Former APAC members were invited to join the Automotive and Capital Goods Industry Trade Advisory Committee (ITAC-2).
