**20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?**

The Worker Advocacy Advisory Committee (WAAC) accomplishes its purpose in accordance with the guidelines in the Federal Advisory Committee Act, the General Services Administration's regulation on the operation of Federal Advisory Committees, and on DOE M 510.1-1, the Advisory Committee Management Program. The WAAC holds public meetings and follows an agenda focused on its charter, the operation of the Office of Worker Advocacy (OWA). The Committee regularly receives testimony in the form of status reports from the Director of the Department of Energy (DOE) Office of Worker Advocacy, as well as from representatives from the Departments of Labor;

Health & Human Services; and Justice, all of whom administer various provisions of the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act of 2000 (EEOICPA). Each Committee meeting includes a Public Comment period, during which members of the public express their views on the implementation of the EEOICPA. In the course of its meetings, the Committee has provided advice and guidance to DOE on the operation of its EEOICPA program and has made a number of specific recommendations through letters to the Secretary of Energy and to the Assistant Secretary for Environment, Safety and Health. The recommendations in these letters have been the subject of much discussion during Committee meetings over the past year, and OWA has implemented many of those recommendations.

**20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?**

The Worker Advocacy Advisory Committee membership is balanced in accordance with statutory and regulatory criteria, including consideration of geographic regions of the country, minority groups, and public and private institutions, as well as the public at large. The committee members represent State workers' compensation agencies, labor unions, workers, communities, and medical and law professionals.

**20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?**

The Worker Advocacy Advisory Committee met once during FY 2003 (on October 21, 2002, in Washington, DC). The Committee meetings have been very relevant to the Committee's charter and the operation of the Office of Worker Advocacy.

**20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?**

At the time the WAAC was chartered, the Office of Worker Advocacy (OWA) was a newly established entity within the Department of Energy (DOE).

There was no other office like it at DOE, and while the staff members of OWA understood the issues associated with this program, most of them did not have experience in running a complex compensation benefits program. DOE was required by statute to have the program up and running within less than nine months from the date the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Act was signed. The Worker Advocacy Advisory Committee members bring to the Department a wealth of knowledge about State workers' compensation law and programs, as well as the various occupational illnesses that are the focus of this program. Their advice and assistance have been invaluable in the establishment of this important program. OWA has determined that, with the physician panels now in operation, our needs for advice are changing, and that we can obtain additional advice and information from other sources. We are working with the American College of Environmental and Occupational Medicine and other professional organizations, to determine the best ways to manage our physician panels and facilitate the disposition of requests for assistance in filing for State Workers' Compensation benefits.

**20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?**
