20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Section 492 of the PHS Act states that The Secretary...shall by regulation require appropriate technical and scientific peer review of -- (A) applications...; and (B)... biomedical and behavioral research and development contracts.... This committee is composed entirely of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide

first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical research grant applications in the area of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome as well as prevention and treatment of the major opportunistic infections associated with AIDS. During this report period, the committee reviewed 38 grant applications requesting \$3,987,968 in direct costs for the first year; 38 applications were scored, with recommended direct costs of \$3,987,968 for the first year, subject to negotiation at the time of award.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The members of this committee are authorities knowledgeable in the fields of AIDS related epidemiology, virology, pharmacology, immunology, molecular biology, pathology, treatment, and vaccines.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The committee held three meetings during this reporting period.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

This committee is composed entirely of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level review of highly scientific and technical research grant applications and contract proposals. These evaluations and recommendations cannot be obtained from other sources because the specialized, complex nature of the applications and proposals requires a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from other

established sources.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the committee were closed to the public for the review of grant applications and contract proposals. Sections 552b(c)(4) and 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permits the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal confidential trade secrets or commercial property such as patentable material and personal information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
